As a political expert at the embassy, Mr. Garrett specializes in Human Rights, Trafficking in Persons, and International Organizations. According to the U.S. Department of State, human trafficking is a form of modern-day slavery. Victims of trafficking are exploited for commercial sex or labor purposes. Traffickers use force, fraud or coercion to achieve exploitation. After drug dealing, human trafficking is tied with the illegal arms trade as the second largest criminal industry in the world, and it is the fastest-growing.

Bradley K. Martin, who has been following Korean peninsula issues since 1977, is the author of *Under the Loving Care of the Fatherly Leader: North Korea and the Kim Dynasty* (New York: St. Martin's Press, 2004). He has worked as Tokyo bureau chief of Newsweek, The Asian Wall Street Journal, and the Asian Financial Intelligence. He was also deputy

executive editor of Asia Times in Bangkok, and Sun bureau chief in Beijing and New Delhi. From 2002-2005 he was a visiting professor of journalism, first at Ohio University and then at Louisiana State University. He currently is a Tokyo-based senior writer for Bloomberg News.
