With nearly 25 years of working in Japan, one of the main current campaign focuses of Greenpeace is on the nuclear energy issue. Right after the Fukushima disaster, Greenpeace was the first independent global organisation documenting and publishing the actual consequences of the incident, revealing the true scale of the situation. In this context, a historical window of opportunity was opened for Japan to shift towards renewable sources of energy.
